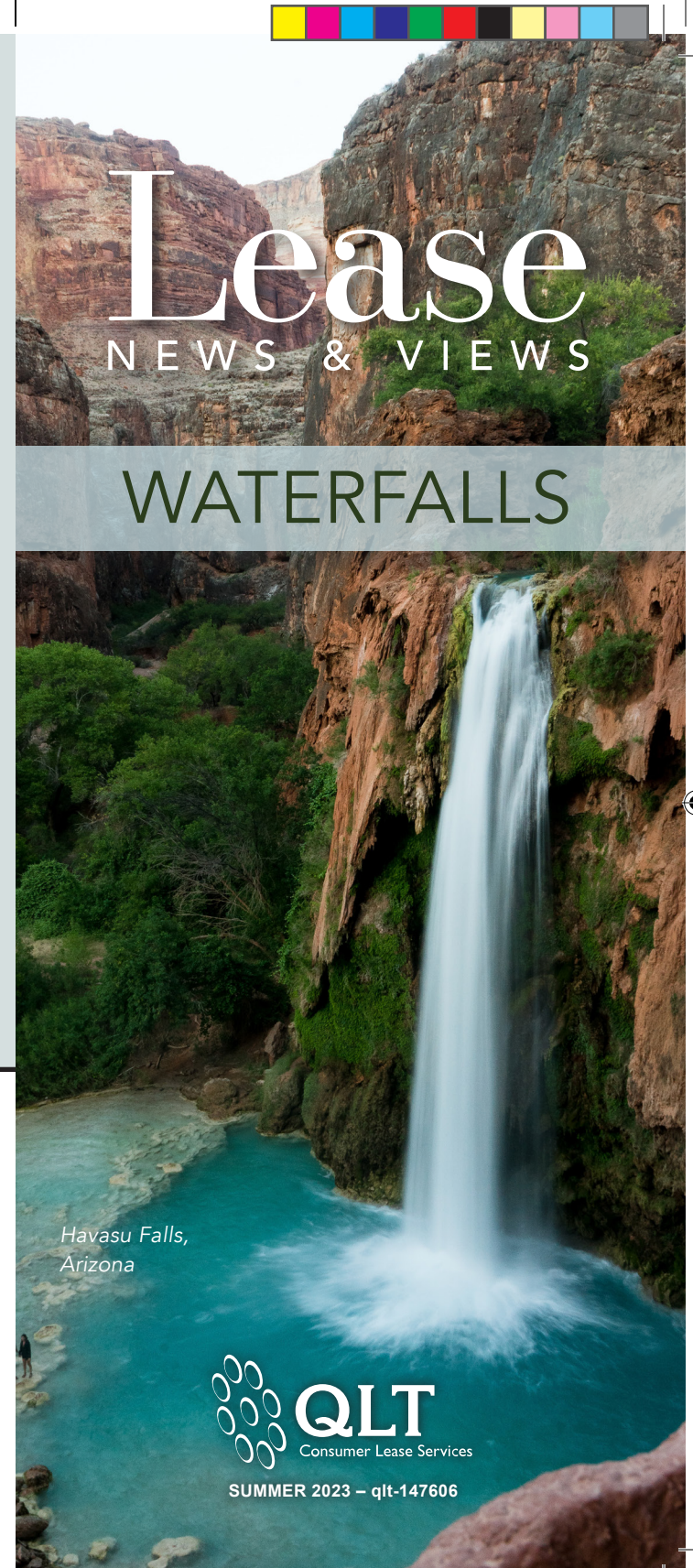

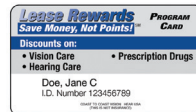

Known for their beauty and tranquility, waterfalls offer many possibilities, from a rewarding destination for a hiking excursion to inspiration for artistic expressions such as photography or writing. It's no surprise that they are popular tourist attractions, and with a little research and planning, a trip to the falls is an adventure the whole family can enjoy.

Lucky for us, the United States is home to many documented waterfalls. In fact, every state has at least one! Washington, Oregon, and California boast the most waterfalls while Delaware and North Dakota each have just one. With so many waterfalls to choose from, there are many adventures waiting for you.

What Makes a Waterfall a Waterfall?

A waterfall occurs when water from a stream or river falls over a steep incline. Rock erosion can play an

important part in the formation of waterfalls.

While many waterfalls flow continuously, some only occur periodically. For instance, rain or melting snow can create or increase a waterstream that leads to a waterfall. These natural phenomena are called ephemeral streams.

Waterfalls are classified by characteristics such as how the water falls, how much water is flowing, and what type of surface is beneath them. There are many types of waterfalls including Cascade, Punchbowl, Block, and Tiered, and they can be in more than one category. 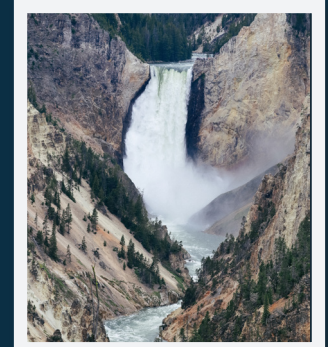

FAMOUS U.S. WATERFALLS



Located in California's Sierra Nevada Mountains, **Yosemite National Park** has 25 named waterfalls ranging in size from 100 to 2,425 feet tall. You can walk to many of them from short accessible paved trails and see many others from designated view points.

Yellowstone, America's first national park, is home to 45 named waterfalls and hundreds of others that are unnamed. Like Yosemite, Yellowstone offers clear sightlines to many of its majestic waterfalls.



Not to be outdone by the beautiful West Coast waterfalls, the East Coast is home to one of the world's most famous waterfalls: **Niagara Falls**. Niagara, a block waterfall that spans parts of Canada and New York, is comprised of three distinct waterfalls. Horseshoe Falls (also known as the

Canadian Falls in Ontario, Canada) is the largest of the three. Located in New York, the American Falls is taller than Horseshoe yet it does not have the same impressive flow of water. Also located in New York, the Bridal Falls is the smallest of the three.
